ITEM 1511-40: Approving an Amendment to the FY 2016-2025 Transportation Improvement Program to Add and Delete Projects in Atlantic City

PROPOSAL

At its November 9, 2015 meeting, the Technical Advisory Committee recommended that the Policy Board approve two amendments, one to add a project and one to delete a project from the FY 2016-2025 TIP.

PROJECTS

DB# S 1408 Atlantic Avenue, Connecticut Avenue to Maine Street

Atlantic City is requesting this mill and overlay resurfacing project be deleted from the FY 2016-2025 TIP/STIP. The project is currently programmed for Design in FY 2016 in the amount of \$50,000 and for \$1.110 million in construction funds in FY 2017.

DB# S 1602 Atlantic Avenue, Morris Avenue to Rhode Island Avenue

Atlantic City is requesting this mill and overlay resurfacing project be added to the FY 2016-2025 TIP/STIP. The City is requesting Design in FY 2016 in the amount of \$100,000 and \$1.110 million in construction funds in FY 2017.

BACKGROUND

The Atlantic Avenue, Morris Avenue to Rhode Island Avenue, mill and overlay resurfacing project is being funded from the deletion of the Atlantic Avenue, Connecticut Avenue to Maine Street, mill and overlay resurfacing project in FY 2016 and FY 2017. The additional \$50,000 in FY 2016 (Design) is funded with unprogrammed money within the SJTPO allocation of State funding.

SUMMARY

These Minor Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) Amendments will be recommended for Policy Board action by the Technical Advisory Committee per Section A(2) of the latest Memorandum of Understanding between the South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization, New Jersey Department of Transportation, and New Jersey Transit Corporation.

PROPOSAL

The following TIP Amendments are being recommended for Policy Board approval as follows:

PROJECTS

DB# S 1408 Atlantic Avenue, Connecticut Avenue to Maine Street, Atlantic City is requesting this mill and overlay resurfacing project be deleted from the FY 2016-2025 TIP/STIP. The project is currently programmed for Design in FY 2016 in the amount of \$50,000 and for \$1.110 million in construction funds in FY 2017.

DB# S 1602 Atlantic Avenue, Morris Avenue to Rhode Island Avenue, Atlantic City is requesting this mill and overlay resurfacing project be added to the FY 2016-2025 TIP/STIP. The City is requesting Design in FY 2016 in the amount of \$100,000 and \$1.110 million in construction funds in FY 2017.

BACKGROUND

The Atlantic Avenue Morris Avenue to Rhode Island Avenue, mill and overlay resurfacing project is being funded from the deletion of the Atlantic Avenue, Connecticut Avenue to Maine Street, mill and overlay resurfacing project in FY 2016 and FY 2017. The additional \$50,000 in FY 2016 (Design) is funded with unprogrammed money within the SJTPO allocation of State funding.

The switching of these two projects will not have a negative impact on the air quality in the region.

Fiscal constraint will be maintained as the funding for the new project falls within the SJTPO allocation of State funding.

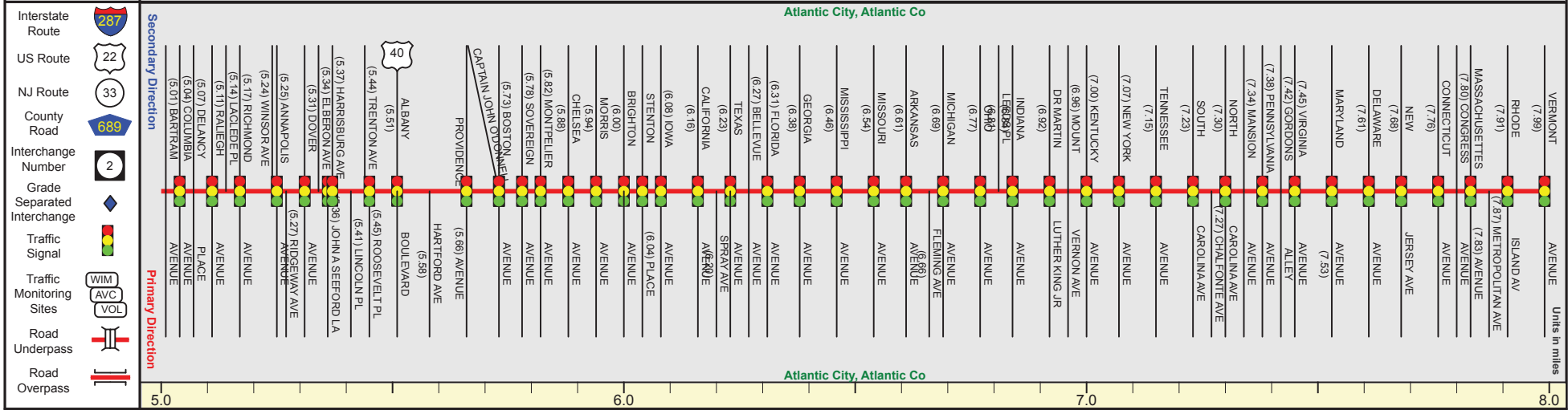

RESOLUTION 1511-40: Approving an Amendment to the FY 2016-2025 Transportation Improvement Program to Add and Delete Projects in Atlantic City

WHEREAS, the South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization (SJTPO) is the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) designated under federal law for the southern region of New Jersey including Atlantic, Cape May, Cumberland, and Salem Counties; and

WHEREAS, MPO's are responsible for developing a Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) that sets forth the capital expenditures for at least four years, as required by the Federal Metropolitan Planning Rule (23 CFR 450C and 49 CFR 613C); and

WHEREAS, Atlantic City is requesting that DB# S 1408 Atlantic Avenue, Connecticut Avenue to Maine Avenue, mill and overlay resurfacing project be deleted from the FY 2016-2025 TIP; and

WHEREAS, Atlantic City is requesting that DB# S 1602 Atlantic Avenue, Morris Avenue to Rhode Island Avenue, mill and overlay resurfacing project be added to the FY 2016-2025 TIP/STIP; and

WHEREAS, the additional design costs for the new project will be is funded with unprogrammed money within the SJTPO allocation of State funding and the construction costs for these projects are equivalent, thus maintaining fiscal constraint; and

WHEREAS, the New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT), New Jersey Transit, and SJTPO have entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on Procedures to Amend and Modify the SJTPO TIP and the State TIP; and


WHEREAS, public involvement requirements under SJTPO's adopted policy have been satisfied by a supplemental notice to the Citizens Advisory Committee mailing list and a specific opportunity for comment prior to Board action; and

WHEREAS, this change of projects will not have a negative impact on the air quality in the region; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Policy Board of the South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization hereby amends the FY 2016-2025 Transportation Improvement Program to delete a project and replace it with a new project.
