I. INTRODUCTION

This Request for Proposals is a sixty-one-page document. Please read each page, including, without limitation, all attachments.

The terms "firm", "contractor", "proposer", "vendor", "consultant", "and respondent" may be used interchangeably throughout this document.

A. General

The South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization (SJTPO) is soliciting proposals from qualified firms, or groups of firms, to provide professional services in the development of an SJTPO Regional Freight Plan. Technical proposals must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the goals, requirements, format, and guidelines presented in this RFP document.

The SJTPO is the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization for Atlantic, Cape May, Cumberland, and Salem Counties. As such, the SJTPO has responsibility or oversight for all federally funded surface transportation planning activities in the region.

The SJTPO, in accordance with the law, reserves the right to reject any and all proposals received in response to this RFP, when determined to be in the SJTPO's best interest and to waive minor non-compliance in a proposal. The SJTPO further reserves the right to make such investigations as it deems necessary as to the qualifications of any and all firms submitting proposals in response to this RFP. In the event that all proposals are rejected or if the SJTPO, at any time, deems the number of qualified firms receiving designations as the result of this RFP to be insufficient to meet the potential needs of the SJTPO, or for any other reason, the SJTPO reserves the right to re-solicit proposals. The SJTPO shall not be deemed obligated at any time to award any contract to any proposer.

This work is included as a two-year study in the SJTPO FY 2023 Unified Planning Work Program (www.sjtpo.org/UPWP) as amended July 25, 2022. The availability of funds is subject to execution of an agreement modification for SJTPO's UPWP. The award of this project is subject to the availability of funds and pending authorization from the NJDOT.

B. Submission

Please take note that this RFP requires <u>digital and physical submission</u> of the proposal. Please read all instructions carefully before submitting.

Digital submission: A digital copy of the Signed Cover Letter and Technical Proposal must be received no later than **11:59 P.M.**, prevailing time, on **Tuesday, November 8, 2022,** to bschiavi@sjtpo.org. An email will be sent confirming receipt no later than Wednesday, November 9, 2022. To receive a confirmation email before the submission deadline, submissions are encouraged before 5:00 P.M on November 8th.

Physical submission: One (1) physical copy of the Signed Cover Letter and Technical Proposal *must be submitted in a sealed envelope with the title of the RFP clearly marked on the outside*. The physical submission should be sent on the day of the digital submission and must be received by 3:30 P.M., the prevailing time on Tuesday, November 15, 2022. The SJTPO shall not be held responsible for the timeliness of mail or messenger delivery. Submittals should be addressed to:

<u>Proposals received after the date and time specified above will not be opened or reviewed and will be returned unopened to the responding proposer.</u>

Elements required in the submission include:

- 1. Signed Cover Letter, submitted with both the digital and physical submissions, that indicates review and acceptance of SJTPO Standard Contract Agreement Boilerplate (Exhibit I) or identifies "Exceptions to the Agreement". (see Section I.E) The signed proposal shall be considered an offer on the part of the proposer. Such offer shall be deemed accepted upon execution of a final contract.
- 2. Technical Proposal, inclusive of the items listed, in the order shown below. (one (1) electronic copy as part of the digital submission and one (1) hard copy as part of the physical submission).
 - a. Narrative that reflects the requirements of the Scope of Work (see Section II)
 - A detailed approach to completing the work program
 - List and description of deliverables
 - Any issues or problems with requirements of the Scope
 - **b. Staffing Plan** (see Exhibit D) with dollar values (a detailed description of the work team key staff and estimated hours required on the project), including:

 - Person-hour requirements by task
 - Hourly rates
 - It should be clear which staff/firm(s) count towards the DBE/ESBE goal (see Section IV). In addition, the DBE/ESBE percentage should be clearly stated within this section.

C. Trade Secret and Proprietary Information

The Open Public Records Act mandates public access to government records. However, proposals submitted in response to this RFP may contain technical, financial, or other data whose public disclosure could cause substantial injury to a Proposer's competitive position or constitute a trade secret. To protect legally exempt information and records from disclosure under the Open Public Records Act, the Proposer should specifically identify the pages of the proposal that contain such information, by properly marking the applicable pages and inserting the following notice in the front of its proposal. The SJTPO reserves the right to determine whether the identified information and records are exempt from public disclosure and will advise the proposer accordingly.

D. Interpretations and Addenda

All questions and requests for interpretations related to this RFP must be submitted in writing and received on or before **Thursday**, **October 20**, **2022**. Interpretations or clarifications in response to questions received by prospective proposers will be posted on the SJTPO website. F. Contracting

The contract with SJTPO will be executed via the South Jersey Transportation Authority (SJTA), the administrative host of the SJTPO. All provisions and requirements of the SJTA pertaining to contractual matters will be in effect. This project is funded by the Federal Highway Administration of the United States Department of Transportation. Accordingly, the selected consultant will be required to comply with all applicable federal procurement laws, regulations, and contract provisions required by the federal funding authority. Additionally, all state regulations and provisions of the SJTPO's prime contract with the NJDOT, the prime recipient of the federal grant, will be passed on to the consultant.

Proposers shall be prepared to accept the terms and conditions of SJTPO's Standard Contract Agreement included as Exhibit I (SJTPO Standard Contract Agreement Boilerplate) hereto. If a proposer desires to take exception to the agreement, the proposer shall provide the following information as a section of the proposal identified as "Exceptions to the Agreement":

- 1. Proposer shall clearly identify each proposed change to the agreement, including all relevant exhibits and attachments.
- **2.** Proposer shall furnish the reasons therefore as well as specific recommendations for alternative language.

All proposals must include a signed cover letter that indicates review and acceptance of the SJTPO Standard Contract Agreement boilerplate (Exhibit I) or includes the abovementioned "Exceptions to the Agreement."

II. SCOPE OF WORK

Proposals should explicitly address the full scope of the project as described within this section. Proposals should detail any concerns which impact the successful completion of the project as described herein or if additional innovations or alternative tasks are recommended enhancing the intended project scope.

A successful proposal will demonstrate significant freight planning expertise, a strong knowledge of federal, state, and regional requirements, and staff availability to develop the Plan within the expected project timeline. This Plan must be in conformance with the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) and other active federal guidelines. Teams are encouraged to include technical economic development and land use strategic planning capabilities for the preparation of a comprehensive and strategic regional freight plan. The successful consultant or team must demonstrate previous similar project expertise, technical capabilities of proposed staff, and a solid understanding of the proposed scope of work. A strong understanding of the regional issues in the four-county SJTPO region is highly desirable.

A. Background

The Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) emphasizes the need for the transportation network to support economic development, which South Jersey residents have consistently rated as one of their top priorities for the regional transportation plan. Therefore, a primary goal of SJTPO is to work toward a multimodal transportation network that contributes to the region's economic development. To this end, SJTPO is working to better integrate freight into its transportation planning process.

SJTPO has been an active participant in numerous Statewide freight planning efforts. The 2017 New Jersey Statewide Freight Plan summarized current and future freight planning and transportation needs on a statewide level and performed an analysis of New Jersey's roadway network. However, regional and local freight planning is needed to support potential future local transportation infrastructure improvements in the SJTPO region. SJTPO completed the Regional Freight Plan Data Gathering and Analysis Study in 2022 in preparation for this Plan. The selected consultant will utilize that information and other resources to produce a freight plan for the SJTPO region.

B. Objective

This RFP details several tasks, background items, and resources that are laid out to provide an understanding of the work being sought through this effort. The overall objective is the development of a Regional Freight Plan that is grounded in good quality, well-documented data and makes well-supported recommendations on the identified regional freight network. Consultant teams should review the Scope of Work section in this document, understand the needs of SJTPO and its region, and submit a proposal that addresses these needs.

Consultant teams are encouraged to deviate from the specific details identified in the following sections if their experience and expertise offer an alternative approach. Deviations should be clearly discussed to ensure reviewers understand that objectives have been addressed, just by other means. Consultant teams are encouraged to identify efficiencies in the process that achieve the objectives and tasks communicated in this RFP.

C. Recent Relevant Work

The selected consultant team will integrate previous studies, as well as state and regional plans, while preparing the Plan and propose the best use of its planning resources to produce the most effective product. A list of available resources, including past studies that are relevant to this current effort are provided below.

A significant amount of relevant work was performed for the 2022 SJTPO Regional Freight Plan Data Collection and Analysis study. This study identified the SJTPO freight transportation network, network modes, and intermodal links. The study also applied data-driven measures to assess the freight network's performance; and identified some network locations of interest, and key issues. The study performed significant analysis of INRIX data to assist with the identification of existing truck freight conditions in the region. SJTPO will provide the selected consultant team with all data analysis to be used freely throughout the life of the project.

The Plan will also build upon the 2018 SJTPO Port of Salem Corridor Freight Rail Intermodal Study. That study provided a comprehensive survey of the corridor, including the port, rail, roads, bridges, and intermodal facilities. The study identified key freight access and mobility issues, for current and potential corridor users (agricultural and or industrial). The study produced a list of prioritized recommended solutions. The solutions were detailed sufficiently to provide the basis for project development.

The New Jersey Statewide Freight Plan (2022), and the New Jersey State Rail Plan (2022) are two important efforts in progress that are to be considered. The Plan is to be consistent with regional and state goals and objectives.

D. Content

A total of eight tasks are envisioned for the development of SJTPO's Regional Freight Plan as part of this effort. The consultant should evaluate each task, consider the purpose and value communicated by each, and is invited to offer deviations that best serve the purpose of this effort based on experiences on other similar efforts. Alternative approaches are encouraged. The consultant team should provide a detailed description of the alternative approach proposed, including the benefits, and data used.

- Task 1. Coordination and Administrative Tasks
- Task 2. Stakeholder and Public Involvement
- Task 3. Freight Network Data Quality Assessment
- Task 4. Network and Facility Issues and Analysis
- Task 5. Identify Model Policies and Best Practices Relevant to SJTPO Regional Issues
- Task 6. Freight Plan Recommendations, Prioritized List of Regional Actions
- Task 7. Funding Opportunities
- Task 8. Regional Freight Plan Final Report

Task 1. Coordination and Administrative Tasks

Regular communication shall take place between the consultant's project manager and the SJTPO project manager. The firm will be responsible to document all communications and deliver them to SJTPO. Meetings shall require meeting minutes to be prepared, whereas phone conversations shall simply require a follow-up email summarizing talking points and decisions made. These should generally be provided to SJTPO within three (3) business days.

The consultant shall provide brief status updates every two weeks to SJTPO via email. The status updates should describe tasks completed in the past two weeks, upcoming tasks for the next four weeks, any delays that affect the schedule of the project, and any assistance that will be needed from SJTPO or other stakeholders in the coming weeks. Updates should also note the status of the DBE/ESBE firm(s) in achieving their goal and highlight any concerns about achieving that goal as soon as it becomes apparent.

The consultant is to produce and update, as needed, a detailed project schedule, including the expected meeting dates, task completion dates, and other tasks and milestones. All work is anticipated to be completed by end of May 2024, as stated in Section D. Schedule.

- **Deliverable 1.a. Bi-weekly emails:** The consultant will provide an email to SJTPO's project manager on a bi-weekly basis as described above.
- **Deliverable 1.b.** Meeting and discussion summaries: The consultant will provide minutes of meetings and email summaries of all conversations, which will include a summary of talking points and decisions made within three (3) business days.
- **Deliverable 1.c. Project Schedule:** Including expected meeting dates, task completion dates, and bi-weekly conference call schedule, to be updated as needed.

Task 2. Stakeholder and Public Involvement

The SJTPO Freight Advisory Committee (FAC) was formed during the 2022 SJTPO Regional Freight Plan Data Collection and Analysis study. This committee is made up of planning partners with an interest in freight transportation. The FAC should be solicited as needed for guidance and feedback throughout the project. The FAC does not have a regular meeting schedule, as such the consultant should work with SJTPO's project manager to schedule meeting as necessary. In addition, the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC), made up of planners and engineers in the SJTPO region should be updated and given opportunities to provide feedback at key milestones in the process. The TAC meets bimonthly beginning in January, with workshop opportunities during off-months. The consultant should propose the frequency of communications with the FAC and TAC, noting the purpose of their involvement, the format of their involvement (inperson meeting, virtual meeting, email), and note this in the proposed project schedule. The consultant shall be expected to lead any proposed workshops, while SJTPO's project manager can provide updates to the FAC and TAC as recommended by the consultant. The consultant should lead an in-person workshop, presenting a draft of the Final Report in February 2024. Members of our FAC, TAC, and select stakeholders will be invited.

A stakeholder outreach effort was conducted as part of the 2022 study. A summary of this outreach is available as part of this RFP's resources (Memo and Final Report Interview Notes and Public Comment Map View). It has been SJTPO's aim to include active participation and feedback from stakeholders from the freight community to provide qualitative input, to supplement the quantitative data that inform this effort. Stakeholder involvement did not meet SJTPO's initial expectations. While 20 stakeholder interviews were initially planned, only 11 stakeholder organizations participated in interviews. In addition, six stakeholders participated in the FAC and provided feedback through that effort. Proposers should review the outreach summary and are asked to discuss the need to balance robust feedback with the need to preserve project resources and schedule in completing this effort. Proposals should either propose some additional stakeholder outreach or alternative approaches to ensure that needed information is reflected in this current process. If additional stakeholder outreach is proposed, please discuss approaches to ensure better participation.

Proposals should identify the need and degree of public involvement recommended for this effort and are encouraged to cite examples on similar efforts to support the recommendations. As this effort is regional in nature, any public outreach proposed would need to address the needs of Spanish-speaking individuals as well as address households with limited internet access if a virtual approach is proposed. If public meetings (virtual, hybrid, or in-person) are needed, the consultant will lead and schedule the public participation activities with selected direction, support, and assistance from SJTPO staff and planning partners as appropriate.


- **Deliverable 2.a.** FAC and TAC Meetings/Updates including meeting materials and meeting notes
- **Deliverable 2.b. 2024 February SJTPO FAC / TAC Workshop** including PowerPoint Presentation, other meeting materials, and meeting notes

Deliverable 2.d. Public Meetings, if applicable. Includes any presentations, handouts, surveys, survey maps, meetings notes, etc.

Task 3. Freight Network Data Quality Assessment

The SJTPO Regional Freight Plan Data Collection and Analysis technical study summarized network facilities based on the estimated daily truck volumes and percentages, using a number of factors including vehicle classification counts, FHWA Freight Analysis Framework (FAF) estimates, and Freight Trip Generation (FTG) estimates based on census block-level employment and industry type. SJTPO is generally pleased with the effort and the estimates developed. Despite an extensive initial stakeholder involvement effort, stakeholder feedback, which is often essential to validate outputs like this, was limited. At the conclusion of this effort, an instance was identified where freight volume was believed to be underrepresented. The consultant should identify a method to conduct a succinct high-level quality assessment with the purpose being to identify if there are critical freight areas that may be notably underrepresented.

The area shown in the figure below is provided as an example of an area believed to be underrepresented in the freight network estimates, based upon local knowledge. Given the extensive effort to broadly receive stakeholder feedback and the limited response previously received, a broad stakeholder feedback effort is not desired. SJTPO recommends that the consultant identify a high-level screening method to identify possible areas where freight activity may be greatly underrepresented. While these instances are presumed to be limited, the assessment is a beneficial quality control exercise. While the method of screening is to be identified by the consultant, based on their experience in the area, some possible data sources considered by SJTPO include land use, zoning, or freight generator data. Areas identified as possibly underrepresented in the data should then be followed-up with targeted stakeholder outreach, which can be conducted by SJTPO, as well as possible classification traffic counts.



SJTPO requests that proposals include a budget for no fewer than 10 classification counts to be conducted, based upon areas identified in the screening. The consultant may identify an alternate method to classification counts if it seems another approach as more efficient or otherwise superior. These pieces of information will then be incorporated into the dataset by the consultant

before it is used in the remainder of this planning effort. This includes 33 truck counts conducted by the City of Vineland that are not included in the current dataset.

Deliverable 3.a. Quality Assessment of Freight Network Volume Estimates

Deliverable 3.b. Classification Counts or other method The consultant will conduct no fewer than 10 classification counts, based upon areas identified in the screening. The consultant may identify an alternate method to classification counts if it seems another approach as more efficient or otherwise superior.

Task 4. Network and Facility Issues and Analysis

For this task, the consultant is to utilize the results of the 2022 SJTPO Freight Plan Data Collection and Analysis, which summarized network facilities, conditions, and performance and includes freight network infrastructure deficiencies, safety, congestion, bottlenecks, and reliability.

This task will utilize this information to identify freight locations and issues, which are to be analyzed for their impact on the region's freight mobility/network performance, economic vitality, and network resiliency. This analysis will be used to create a **prioritized list of locations** and issues. These locations and issues will be the focus of Task 6.

This analysis will be conducted for all modes including

- Truck / Highway,
- Rail.
- Maritime Port,
- Airports, and
- Intermodal Links Facilities

With this analysis, the consultant will create a new interactive online GIS map. The map, which will be informed by map data developed during the Study, is to identify key areas and facilities within the freight network. The freight network was initially identified in the Study and amended in Task 3 of this project. These are the locations and issues that this analysis deems to be the highest priority, and critical to ensuring regional freight flow that is safe, efficient, reliable, resilient, and contributes to the region's economic vitality.

The consultant should conduct a Truck / Highway mode analysis, to include a Truck Parking Facility/Utilization Rate Analysis and identification of parking locations in the SJTPO region. This analysis should analyze the adequacy of freight truck parking, working with stakeholders to make recommendations related to facilities and or policies.

Truck / Highway mode analysis may utilize the RITIS tool (Regional Integrated Transportation System) which is available to SJTPO and its consultants. This includes the Trip Analytics feature which provides origin and destination (O/D) information.

This analysis of the above freight modes will be used in a later task to produce a prioritized list of projects, programs, and policy recommendations.

Deliverable 4.c. Online Interactive GIS Map Prioritized Freight Locations and Issues

Task 5. Identify Model Policies and Best Practices Relevant to SJTPO Regional Issues The consultant is to identify model policies and practices that reflect areas where the consultant anticipates common issues and opportunities to better serve freight.

The consultant will provide examples of problematic policies and practices (land use, roadway design, etc.) that are likely typical to communities in the region and how to tailor them to better suit the needs of freight. This is an area where the experience of the firms/staff regarding local issues, policies, and practices should be demonstrated in proposals. The consultant is to consider policies and practices related to our region's issues as examples, which are to be developed in Task 4. Truck parking should be among the critical issues addressed in this task.

Consultants should be mindful of the need for balanced policies and practices, particularly given the conflicts that may exist between freight, complete streets, and the safe system approach. Model policies and practices should not undermine the needs for complete streets or the safe system approach, which are context sensitive principles and do not have equal implications across the entire network. For example, recommendations should not be made to expand the footprint of all intersections on the freight network in the interest of freight, as that would conflict in many areas with the needs of other users and their safe and equitable usage of the network. In this example a more nuanced approach would be needed that better reflected the context of different kinds of locations.

In addition, a peer review of two or three similarly sized regions is to be conducted, focusing on best practices technology related to freight mobility. This should identify best practices in utilizing technology, land use, regulatory, and planning practices. Technology solutions may include partners in the public and private sectors to improve freight throughput and increase efficiencies,

For comparative purposes, the review should include regions with similar geographic attributes and freight activities as the SJTPO region and focus on practices to attract private industry, improve commodity flow, and provide regional economic benefits. In accordance with recent federal guidance, applicable industry technological improvements in the areas of Intelligent Transportation Systems (ITS), safety, and security should also be identified, as well as potential opportunities for public/private partnerships and initiatives.

This task will generate a tech memo summarizing this review and detailing model policies and practices related to freight in land use and transportation as well as best practices in freight mobility efficiency, safety, and technology.

Deliverable 5.a. Tech Memo – Model Policies and Practices Relevant to SJTPO

Critical Freight Issues This will include sections focused generally on land use and transportation policies and practices as well as on freight mobility efficiency, safety, and technology.

Task 6. Freight Plan Recommendations, Prioritized List of Regional Actions

Previous tasks will lead to the development of a prioritized list of freight infrastructure improvements, process, and policy actions. The desire is to identify recommended Strategic Freight Corridors, which optimize freight movement benefits and minimizes adverse impacts. The task shall also include a list of recommendations for policies, strategies, and projects for inclusion in the planning process of SJTPO and our partners. Recommendations should be considered based on current conditions, safety, mobility, accessibility, reliability, cost-effectiveness, use of efficient modes, resiliency, land use policy, and economic impact.

The recommendations should be categorized, such as:

- Quick-Start Projects: low cost, with a short implementation horizon to demonstrate to private sector partners that their input was received and acted upon
- Program Enhancements for Improving Freight: short implementation horizon of freight action strategies, policies, and projects that can enhance existing planning activities of SJTPO and planning partners to better incorporate freight considerations in an ongoing manner
- Future Surface Transportation Projects: short implementation horizon potential projects that will require further analysis prior to implementation
- **SJTPO Freight Horizon Projects:** projects that, due to their nature, are relatively high cost and/or may require long time horizons (e.g., more than 5 years)

One specific area where program enhancements should be addressed is with regard to the SJTPO Project Evaluation Process. This process, which was redeveloped in 2020, includes a Project Pre-Evaluation Screening, designed to identify issues, and improve project scopes, and Project Evaluation Criteria and Scoring, which identifies a number score based on the merits of the scoped project. The freight criteria were developed prior to the 2022 Regional Freight Plan Data Gathering and Analysis Study and should be updated to ensure that freight is meaningfully addressed consistent with the available data and the Regional Freight Plan being developed via this study. The consultant is asked to identify how SJTPO's Project Evaluation Process can best incorporate the available freight data and outputs of the Regional Freight Plan.

Note that emphasis should be placed on projects that are on the county and municipal system, and not on the State network. Recommendations can be made regarding the State network; however, all detailed work for recommendations should be reserved for the local freight network.

Therefore, the deliverable for this task is a tech memo to include recommendations that are prioritized and categorized by time horizon, including the following:

• Identify the Recommended Strategic Freight Corridors. Please note the available resources for work already completed in this area. Only additional required work should be proposed by the consultant. The Recommended Strategic Freight Corridors are the critical corridors. This is a subset of the regional freight network that was identified in the previous study and amended in Task 3 of this project.

- **Prioritize List of Regional Actions.** Solutions are to be detailed sufficiently to provide the basis for project development
- Organize recommendations into four categories: Quick Start (short-term), Program Enhancements (short-term), Future Surface Transportation Projects (medium-term), and Freight Horizon Projects (long-term)
- Identify the Recommended Strategic Freight Corridors. The previous study identified the freight network, and Task 3 of this study amended that freight network. Task 4 of this project, Network and Facility Issues and Analysis, identifies a prioritized list of locations and issues. This Task 4 analysis incorporates economic impact, resiliency, and other important factors. Therefore, the consultant is able to identify the most important portions of the network. These are the corridors, that network users are using the most, or should be encouraged to use. These are also the corridors that should be closely monitored for future improvements. This subset of the freight network is to be called the Recommended Strategic Freight Corridors (RSFC). The RSFC is to be a separate layer on the networks' GIS map.

This deliverable is to be reviewed and updated based on the feedback of the Freight Advisory Committee (FAC) and Technical Advisory Committee (TAC). The infrastructure or program recommendations are intended for eventual inclusion within the SJTPO Regional Transportation Plan and the SJTPO Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Deliverable 6.a. Tech Memo - Freight Plan Recommendations Prioritize List of Regional Actions

Task 7. Funding Opportunities

The consultant is to identify and provide guidance to SJTPO for utilizing funding sources that are appropriate for the critical freight projects, including but not limited to New Jersey Local Freight Impact Fund and the federal Infrastructure for Rebuilding America (INFRA) Grants program. Efforts within this task should consider the following:

- Identify INFRA eligible projects within the SJTPO region
- Identify segments suited for New Jersey Local Freight Impact Fund consideration
- Identify other state and federal funding sources suited for the recommended projects
- Recommend steps SJTPO should take to obtain INFRA and other freight funds
- Identify potential future private partnerships

Deliverable 7.a. Tech Memo – Funding Opportunities

Task 8. Regional Freight Plan Final Report

A Regional Freight Plan Final Report for the four-county SJTPO region will be developed that includes a detailed discussion of activities performed during the project, outcomes resulting from the project's tasks and activities, and a thorough analysis of project findings. This report should summarize current freight transportation demand, trends, challenges, infrastructure conditions, performance, opportunities, and recommendations.

The consultant will present the Draft Regional Freight Plan to the FAC and TAC for review and comments at a workshop held no later than February 2024. Once the Draft Plan has been

reviewed and all comments addressed, a Final Regional Freight Plan document must be submitted to the SJTPO no later than the end of May 2024. The consultant should state the draft process that they intend to use, including the number of iterations.

The consultant will also prepare a standalone Executive Summary of the Regional Freight Plan, which will be designed to be a visual and easy to understand summary of the Plan for the public. SJTPO would assume this document would be between ten and twenty pages in length.

Deliverable 8.b.	Final Report, incorporating all Tech Memos Drafts will be developed that address comments from SJTPO staff, the FAC, TAC, and the public (if applicable).
Deliverable 8.c.	Final Report Executive Summary Drafts will be developed and comments from SJTPO staff will be addressed.
Deliverable 8.d.	Online Interactive GIS Map and Narrative to include ESRI StoryMap or another format as proposed by consultant which will be incorporated into a Freight webpage on the SJTPO website (which is still under development).

E. Schedule

SJTPO anticipates a Notice to Proceed in early February 2023. The entire project is anticipated to be completed by the end of May 2024.

III. CONSULTANT SELECTION

SJTPO's consultant selection is a qualifications-driven process. Selection is based primarily on an assessment of the technical qualifications of responding firms. However, as a project that does not relate to a direct Planning or Engineering element, the value, quality, and cost of each proposal will also be considered to ensure that public funds are utilized efficiently and in accordance with the SJTPO's mission. A review committee will evaluate each proposal and may recommend firms to present additional information and appear for interviews; or, the proposal may be the sole basis for the selection. Selections will be made at the sole discretion and judgment of the SJTPO.

The following criteria have been established to guide the evaluation of each consultant proposal with each criterion weighted as indicated below. The percentages provided for each criterion are approximate and may vary, depending on the subject matter of the RFP.

A. Technical Approach (Criterion weight: 40 percent)

- 1. Demonstrate a clear understanding of the effort and products required.
- 2. Explicit consideration of the features listed in Section II, Scope of Work.

- 3. Innovations or efficiencies to be used in completing the project with descriptions of how they add value to the project.
- 4. Demonstrate an ability to perform needed tasks and meet the stated completion date.
- **5.** Quality, clarity, and thoroughness in addressing required tasks and submission guidelines.
- **6.** Demonstrate the ability to complete the project within the schedule stated in this document.

B. Value Given Stated Cost (Criterion weight: 20 percent)

- 1. Thoroughly addresses the full scope of the project as described within the RFP and includes a cost.
- 2. Demonstrates a reasonable cost, particularly when evaluated against all of the elements included in the technical scope, demonstrating a great overall value to SJTPO.
- **3.** Innovations proposed that add value for SJTPO or add efficiencies to the project can enhance this evaluation.

C. Firm/Staff Qualifications (Criterion weight: 30 percent)

- 1. Demonstrate successful experience of the firm or team (particularly recent) on <u>similar</u> projects.
- 2. Demonstrate expertise in specialized areas required for this project.
- **3.** Firm(s) references submitted with the proposal.
- 4. Availability of resources needed to successfully complete the project.
- **5.** Staffing Plan demonstrates staff (particularly Project Manager) ability to successfully complete project.
- **6.** Resumes demonstrate staff (particularly Project Manager) experience successfully implementing similar projects.

D. DBE/ESBE Utilization (Criterion weight: 10 percent) (<u>see</u> Section IV for additional information related to the DBE/ESBE criterion)

- **1.** DBE/ESBE firm must be <u>explicitly</u> identified. If a specific DBE/ESBE firm is not identified, a zero percent DBE/ESBE commitment will be assumed.
- 2. Staffing Plan clearly states the hours and specific tasks of DBE/ESBE staff as well as dollar figures or each and percent of the total budget to be dedicated to DBE/ESBE firm(s).
- **3.** Technical Proposals should explicitly indicate the type of work to be completed by the DBE/ESBE firm(s). This information will be used to assess the quality of work to be completed by the DBE/ESBE firm(s).
- 4. If a proposer is unable to secure a DBE/ESBE firm to meet the DBE/ESBE goal, the proposer would need to document in their proposal that a good faith effort was made to meet the goal. See Section IV for the definition of DBE/ESBE firms for more information about documenting a good faith effort. SJTPO will, at its discretion, award points to firms that meet/exceed the DBE goal or satisfactorily document in their proposal that a good faith effort was made in meeting the DBE goal.

Federal and State goals for DBE/ESBE participation must be addressed explicitly in the proposal. This is satisfied by stating the percentage of total project cost devoted to DBE/ESBE firm involvement in the Technical Proposal. See Section IV for the definition of DBE/ESBE

firms. SJTPO utilizes the NJDOT federally approved DBE/ESBE goal (effective 10/1/2019), which is 13.23 percent.

The highest-ranking firms may be invited, at the option of SJTPO, to an interview to present relevant details of their proposals and introduce key staff.

The cost proposals must include a price and level of effort for the Scope of Work. All other charges, such as fringe benefit, overhead, profit, etc., must be identified, yielding a total project cost. Proposals and costs should address the full scope of the project as described within the RFP. Proposals, however, should detail any concerns which impact the successful completion of the project as described herein or if additional innovations or alternative tasks are recommended to enhance the intended project scope. Cost proposals must include all tasks or alternatives discussed within the technical proposal. If applicable, multiple cost scenarios are acceptable.

IV. AWARD OF CONTRACT

The SJTPO will act to award a contract to the successful proposer or to reject all proposals within ninety (90) calendar days after receipt of the proposals as prescribed by law unless an extension is obtained in accordance with SJTPO rules and applicable law.

Upon selection, SJTPO will negotiate a final price with the selected firm. Additional amendments to a proposal may also be negotiated. Selected firms are expected to sign the final form of contract.

The contents of a proposal, and any negotiated amendments, may be incorporated into the final contract. If the SJTPO and the selected firm cannot negotiate an acceptable final contract, negotiations will be terminated and the SJTPO will initiate discussions with the second-ranked firm.

Contracts awarded may be amended to provide for additional services that are closely related to the services requested in this RFP. Any contract amendment for closely related services must be in writing and approved by the SJTPO.

The SJPTO further reserves the right to reject all proposals and issue a new Request for Proposals. Late proposals will not be evaluated and will be returned unopened.

V. DISADVANTAGED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE (DBE) AND EMERGING SMALL BUSINESS PARTICIPATION (ESBE)

A. General

Regulations of the Department of Transportation relative to Non-Discrimination in Federally assisted projects of the Department of Transportation (49 CFR Part 21) are made part of the Agreement. In order to ensure the State of New Jersey Department of Transportation (NJDOT) achieves its federally mandated statewide DBE goal, SJTPO encourages the participation of Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) or Emerging Small Business Enterprise (ESBE), as defined below, in the performance of consultant contracts financed in whole or in part with federal funds. The sub-recipient shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR Part 26 in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts.

- 1. **Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE)** is defined in 49 CFR Part 26, as a small business concern (from Section 3 of the Small Business Act), which is:
 - a. At least 51 percent owned by one or more 'socially and economically disadvantaged' individuals, or in the case of any publicly owned business, at least 51 percent of the stock of which is owned by one or more 'socially and economically disadvantaged' individuals, and
 - **b.** Whose management and daily business operations are controlled by one or more of the 'socially and economically disadvantaged' individuals who own it.

'Socially and economically disadvantaged' is defined as individuals who are citizens of the United States (or lawfully permanent residents) and who are: "Black Americans," "Hispanic Americans", "Native Americans," "Asian-Pacific Americans", "Subcontinent Asian Americans", "Women" (regardless of race, ethnicity, or origin); or "Other" disadvantaged pursuant to Section 8 of the Small Business Act).

- 2. Emerging Small Business Enterprise (ESBE) is defined as a firm that has met the following criteria and obtained small business certification as an ESBE by The State of New Jersey Department of Transportation:
 - **a.** A firm must meet the criteria for a small business as defined by the Small Business Administration in 13 CFR Part 121, which includes annual receipts from all revenues, including affiliate receipts which equates to the annual arithmetic average over the last 3 completed tax years, or by the number of employees.
 - **b.** The small business must be owned by individuals who do not exceed the personal net worth criteria established in 49 CFR Part 26, which is \$1,320,000. All appropriately certified DBEs fall into this definition due to their size.

B. Policy

The consultant agrees that DBE/ESBE firms shall have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of contracts and subcontracts financed in whole or in part with Federal funds provided under this Agreement, the contractor and its subcontractors shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin or sex in the award and performance of USDOT-assisted contracts in accordance with 49 CFR Part 21. DBE requirements of 49 CFR Part 23 applies to this agreement. The SJTPO strongly encourages the use of DBE/ESBEs in all of its contractual efforts.

C. Certified DBE/ESBE Firms

A list of certified ESBE firms is compiled and is effective for contracts on a per calendar year basis. Current guidance on DBE/ESBE is available on the website of the New Jersey Department of Transportation (www.state.nj.us/transportation/business/civilrights). Firms who wish to be considered for DBE/ESBE certification are encouraged to contact the NJDOT Office of Civil Rights directly for information on the certification process. Once a firm is certified, the federal portion of the dollar value of the contract or subcontract awarded to the DBE/ESBE is generally counted toward the applicable DBE/ESBE goal. If state matching and/or non-matching funds are

also awarded to a DBE/ESBE, the total dollar value of the DBE/ESBE contract or subcontract may also be counted toward the applicable DBE/ESBE goal.

There are only two lists that count toward meeting this DBE/ESBE goal. Firms should check these sites before submitting a proposal.

Some certifications have similar requirements, such as MBE, SBE, or any similar certifications in another state – THESE DO NOT COUNT for this goal.

D. Consultant Documentation

If applicable, the Consultant must demonstrate sufficient reasonable efforts to meet the DBE/ESBE contract goals. Additionally, SJTPO has a long-standing commitment to maximizing business opportunities available to DBE/ESBE firms. The consultant's contract is subject to all federal, state, and local laws, rules, and regulations, including but not limited to, non-discrimination in employment and affirmative action for equal employment opportunity. The consultant's contract obligates the consultant to aggressively pursue DBE/ESBEs for participation in the performance of contracts and subcontracts financed in whole or in part with Federal funds. The consultant cannot discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the award and performance of federally assisted contracts. The consultant contract specifies the DBE/ESBE goal and the DBE/ESBE participation rate for that contract, if applicable. The prime consultant contract must document, in writing, all of the steps that led to any selection of the DBE/ESBE firm(s). Before the award of a consultant contract, the consultant must demonstrate sufficient reasonable efforts to utilize DBE/ESBE firms. SJTPO utilizes the NJDOT federally approved DBE/ESBE goal (effective 10/1/2019), which is 13.23 percent.

If at any time a firm intends to subcontract or modify any portion of the work already under contract or intends to purchase material or lease equipment not contemplated during the original preparation of the cost proposal, the firm must notify SJTPO in writing. If, as a result of any subcontract, modification, purchase order, or lease, the actual DBE/ESBE or participation rate for the consultant's contract is in danger of falling below the agreed-upon DBE/ESBE participation, then a request must be made for a DBE/ESBE Goal Exemption Modification through SJTPO.

E. Good Faith Efforts

If the contract goal is not met by the apparent successful firm, evidence of good faith efforts must be presented to the SJTPO for consideration.

To demonstrate sufficient reasonable efforts to meet the DBE or ESBE contract goals, a respondent shall document the steps it has taken to obtain DBE or ESBE participation. Examples of sufficient effort include, but are not limited to, the following efforts:

1. Written notification to DBEs or ESBEs that their interest in the contract is solicited.

- **2.** Efforts made to select portions of work proposed to be performed by DBEs or ESBEs to increase the likelihood of achieving the stated goal.
- **3.** Efforts made to negotiate with DBEs or ESBEs for specific proposals including at a minimum:
 - **a.** The names, addresses, and telephone numbers of DBEs or ESBEs that were contacted;
 - **b.** A description of the information provided to DBEs or ESBEs regarding the scope of work for the specified solicitation; and
 - **c.** A statement of why additional agreements with DBEs or ESBEs were not reached.
- **4.** Information regarding each DBE or ESBE the contractor contacted and rejected as unqualified and the reasons for the contractor's conclusion.
- **5.** Efforts made to assist the DBE or ESBE in obtaining bonding or insurance required by the contractor.

VI. EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY PROVISION

- A. SJTPO in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C. § 2000d to 2000d-4) and the Regulations, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises will be afforded full and fair opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in consideration for an award.
- **B.** All potential Consultants must demonstrate a commitment to the effective implementation of an affirmative action plan or policy on equal employment opportunity. The potential Consultant must ensure equal employment opportunity for all persons and not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment opportunity because of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, physical disability, mental health condition, ancestry, marital status, or criminal record, or political beliefs. The Consultant must uphold and operate in compliance with Executive Order 11246 and as amended in Executive Order 11375, Titles VI and VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Equal Employment Opportunity Act of 1972, and the Fair Employment Practices Act.
- C. In response to this Request for Qualifications/Request for Proposals, the Consultant should furnish documents disclosing Affirmative Action evidence, including a Letter of Federal Approval or Letter of Approval of the EEO/AA Program provided by the NJDOT Division of Civil Rights. If an educational institution/research partner does not have the approval letter, they must submit their Affirmative Action Plan to the NJDOT's Division of Civil Rights for approval.

VII. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Before commencing work under the contract, the selected firm(s) shall furnish the SJTPO with a certificate of insurance for the required insurance coverage(s), as set forth below. Selected firms must provide the SJTPO with a 30-day notice of cancellation, non-renewal, or change in insurance coverage.

- **A.** The Consultant shall carry and maintain in full force and effect for the duration of this contract, and any supplement thereto, appropriate insurance. The Consultant shall submit to the SJTPO, a Certificate of Insurance indicating the existence of the coverage required. Policies shall be issued by an insurance company authorized to do business in the State of New Jersey; and approved by the SJTA.
- **B.** Insurance similar to that required by the Consultant shall be provided by or on behalf of all subconsultants to cover its operation(s) performed under this contract, and include in all subcontracts. The Consultant shall not be issued the Notice to Proceed until evidence of the insurance coverage required has been received, reviewed, and accepted by the SJTPO.
- C. The insurance coverage under such policy or policies shall not be less than specified herein.

SUBCONTRACT AGREEMENT

NAME OF PROJECT

THIS SUBCONTRACT AGREEMENT is made this ____ day of ____, 202__ by and between the **SOUTH JERSEY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY**, having its principal offices located at the Farley Service Plaza, P.O. Box 351, Hammonton, New Jersey 08037, hereinafter referred to as the "Contractor", (party of the first part) and **COMPANY NAME** having offices located at **ADDRESS**, hereinafter referred to as "Subcontractor" or "Recipient", (party of the second part).

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization, having its principal offices located at 782 S. Brewster Road, Unit B-6, Vineland, New Jersey 08361, hereinafter referred to as the "SJTPO", has been established pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of the federal Intermodal Surface Transportation Efficiency Act of 1991 and is the designated Metropolitan Planning Organization for the Counties of Atlantic, Cape May, Cumberland, and Salem in the State of New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, on December 3, 1993, the State of New Jersey, acting through the Commissioner of the Department of Transportation (the "State") entered into a certain basic agreement (the "Basic Agreement") with the Contractor pursuant to which the Contractor agreed to provide administrative staff support to the SJTPO in furtherance of its work program activities and pursuant to which the conditions applicable to the funding and administrative staff support to be provided to the SJTPO by the Contractor and the obligations of the Contractor and the State with respect to such funding were set forth; and

WHEREAS, the State has received project authorization from the Federal Highway Administration for the _____ and in furtherance of such authorization the State will issue to the Contractor a Federal Aid Agreement to the Basic Agreement authorizing the implementation of the Project and establishing funding accounts with respect thereto; and

WHEREAS, the SJTPO has selected the Subcontractor to prepare the Project and has requested the Contractor to engage the Subcontractor for such purposes, and the Subcontractor is desirous of providing the services necessary to perform the Project; and

WHEREAS, the parties are entering into this Subcontract Agreement to set forth their entire agreement and understanding regarding the subcontracting of the Project.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants and promises herein contained, the parties hereto, intending to be legally bound hereby, agree as follows:

1. STATEMENT OF WORK.

(A) The Subcontractor shall provide the necessary personnel, equipment, facilities and supplies to perform the services constituting the Project as specified in the Scope of Work, attached hereto as Appendix N and incorporated herein by reference.

(B) The SJTPO Executive Director shall serve as Contractor's project director for the Project and will advise the Subcontractor in its performance of the required services.

2. DELIVERY OR PERFORMANCE SCHEDULE.

The Subcontractor shall furnish, deliver, and perform the Project, commencing as of the date of this Agreement and continuing through, _____ for which period funds will be available under the Federal Aid Agreement. This Agreement may be extended with the consent of both parties made in writing, subject to extension of the Federal Aid Agreement if necessary.

3. ALLOWABLE COSTS AND PAYMENT.

- (A) Cost. The cost of services to be provided under this Subcontract Agreement is §.
- (B) **Budget.** A budget, which has been agreed to by the parties to this Subcontract Agreement is attached hereto as Appendix N and made part of this Subcontract Agreement for all purposes. No amendment may be made to such budget without the written approval of the Contractor.
- (C) Allowable Costs. Allowable costs must be in accordance with either Federal Acquisition Regulation, Chapter 1, Subpart 31.6, Contracts with State, Local and Federally Recognized Indian Tribal Governments; Subpart 31.3, Contracts with Educational Institutions; Subpart 31.2 Contracts with Commercial Organizations, Subpart 31.7, Contracts with Non-Profit Organization OMB Circular A-87, Cost Principles for State and Local Governments, OMB Circular A-122, Cost Principles for Non-Profit Organizations, or OMB Circular A-21, Cost Principles for Educational Institutions, as applicable.

(D) Payment.

- (1) The Subcontractor shall submit invoices for payment of costs incurred to the SJTPO, not more than monthly, following the commencement of this Subcontract Agreement. A final invoice shall be submitted no later than thirty (30) days after the last day of the Subcontract Agreement. The Contractor's obligation to make payment pursuant to this Agreement shall be subject to the availability of funds under the Federal Aid Agreement.
- (2) Payments for performance under this Subcontract Agreement shall be made by the Contractor to the Subcontractor on a cost reimbursable basis when billed. Any payments so made shall be in accordance with the approved budget, attached as Appendix N. Each invoice shall be accompanied with the appropriate affidavit of payment of wages and documentation of expenditures for each phase of the work, including time and effort reports, and shall be certified by the Chief Financial Officer or Treasurer of the Subcontractor.
- (3) No invoices submitted will be acted upon unless an acceptable Progress Report complying with requirements of paragraph 4(B) below is submitted to the SJTPO, corresponding to the time-period covered in the invoice.

- (4) The Subcontractor shall maintain a complete set of time sheets, records, and accounts to identify salaries, payroll burden, and non-salary direct expenses incurred by personnel directly supporting the invoice. These expenditures shall be documented in compliance with applicable federal and State guidelines and be made available for review. If such documentation is found during annual audits and/or reviews by the federal government and/or the State to be not in compliance with applicable federal and State guidelines, the Subcontractor shall implement an appropriate plan of corrective action to meet all guidelines or repay the undocumented costs to the Contractor.
- (5) The Subcontractor shall maintain all records relating to both negotiations and to costs incurred, which records shall include, but not be limited to, documents, papers, accounting records, and any other evidence pertaining to costs. The Subcontractor shall make such records available at the offices of the Contractor at all reasonable times during the contract period and for three (3) years from the date of final payment and shall furnish copies of the records if requested.
- (E) The Contractor shall not reimburse the Subcontractor for equipment purchases, in accordance with State policies and practices.

4. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

(A) The books of account, files, and other records of the Subcontractor shall, at all times, be available for inspection, review and audit by the Contractor and its representatives to determine the proper application and use of all funds paid to or for the account or benefit of the Subcontractor. In addition, the Subcontractor shall provide such special reports as requested by the Contractor or the SJTPO to permit evaluation of progress of the Project.

(B) Reports.

- (1) The Subcontractor shall prepare a Progress Report and submit it to the SJTPO within ten (10) calendar days after the close of each calendar month following the date of the Notice to Proceed.
 - (2) Each Progress Report shall include:
 - (a) A narrative description of work performed during the period and any difficulties or delays encountered;
 - (b) A comparison of actual accomplishments to the goals established for the period;
 - (c) A comparison, by task, of costs incurred with amounts budgeted; and
 - (d) A comparison, by task, of work performed compared to the schedule, including a percentage of work completed. This requirement can be met by including a bar chart showing schedule timing and actual progress.

(3) The following disclaimer statement shall appear on the cover or the title page of any published report concerning the Project:

The preparation of this report has been financed in part by the U.S. Department of Transportation, Federal Highway Administration. This document is disseminated under the sponsorship of the U.S. Department of Transportation in the interest of information exchange. The United States Government assumes no liability for its contents of its use thereof.

(C) [Reserved]

- (D) The Subcontractor agrees that Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE), as defined in 49 CFR Part 26 and FTA Circular 4716.1A, shall have the maximum opportunity to participate in the performance of contracts and subcontracts financed, in whole or in part, with federal funds provided under this Subcontract Agreement. For this agreement, a good faith effort should result in a **minimum DBE utilization of %**, consistent with the Cost Proposal associated with this Project.
- (E) Regulations of the New Jersey Department of Transportation relative to Restrictions on Lobbying is made a part of this Subcontract Agreement (Appendix A).
- (F) The New Jersey Department of Transportation Certification of RECIPIENT is made a part of this Subcontract Agreement (Appendix B).
- (G) The Certification of South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization is made a part of this Subcontract Agreement (Appendix C).
- (H) The New Jersey Department of Transportation Code of Ethics for Vendors is made a part of this Subcontract Agreement (Appendix D).
- (I) The New Jersey Department of Transportation Certification of RECIPIENT Eligibility is made a part of this Subcontract Agreement (Appendix E).
- (J) The New Jersey Department of Transportation Americans with Disabilities Act provisions are made a part of this Subcontract Agreement (Appendix F).
- (K) The State of New Jersey Equal Employment Opportunities for Contracts Funded by FHWA is made a part of this Subcontract Agreement (Appendix G).
- (L) Equal Employment Opportunity Requirements for Procurement and Service Contracts in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 10:2-1 through 10:2-4 and N.J.S.A. 10:5-3, et seq. is made a part of this Subcontract Agreement.
- (M) The United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) Standard Title VI/Non-Discrimination Assurances DOT Order No. 1050.2A is made a part of this Subcontract Agreement (Appendix H through Appendix L). These appendices apply to the Subcontractor, who shall notify each potential subcontractor or supplier of the Subcontractor obligations under this Subcontract and the Acts and the Regulations relative to Non-discrimination on the grounds of race, color, or national origin.

- (N) In the event of non-compliance by the Subcontractor with the nondiscrimination provisions of this Subcontract Agreement, the Contractor shall impose such sanctions as it may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to:
 - (1) Withholding payments to the Subcontractor until the Subcontractor complies; and
 - (2) Cancelling, terminating, or suspending this Subcontract Agreement, in whole or in part.
- (O) This Subcontract Agreement may be terminated: (1) immediately for non-compliance in accordance with paragraph 4(H) above; (2) if funds are not forthcoming to Contractor pursuant to the Basic Agreement; (3) by mutual agreement; and (4) by Contractor in the event Subcontractor fails to perform its obligations under this Agreement. In the event the Agreement is terminated as a result of the Subcontractor's failure to perform, the Subcontractor shall turn over to the Contractor all work product developed under the Scope of the Work to the date of termination and shall reimburse the Contractor for all funds paid to the Subcontractor to the date of termination.
- (P) If Subcontractor has not commenced the Project within two (2) months after the execution of this Subcontract Agreement, Subcontractor may be notified in writing that the funding hereunder is rescinded, and this Subcontract Agreement is terminated with no penalty to either Party except as expressly provided for in this Subcontract Agreement.
- (Q) This Subcontract Agreement may not be assigned, in whole or in part, without the prior written consent of the Contractor.
- (R) Indemnification. The Subcontractor hereby agrees to and shall defend, indemnify, protect and save harmless the Contractor and the SJTPO, its or their agents, servants, and employees, from and against all suits, claims, losses, demands or damages to the extent arising out of or claimed to arise out of the negligent acts, errors or omissions or intentional acts or omissions of the Subcontractor, its agents, servants, employees and subcontractors, of its obligation pursuant to this Subcontract Agreement or any breach of any of its representations, warranties or covenants set forth herein. The Subcontractor shall, at its own expense, pay all charges for attorneys and all costs and other expenses arising from any such suit or claim incurred in connection therewith. If any judgment shall be rendered against the Contractor and/or the SJTPO for which indemnification is provided under this paragraph, the Subcontractor shall, at its own expense, satisfy and discharge the same. This indemnification obligation is not limited by but is in addition to the insurance obligations contained in this Subcontract Agreement. This Indemnification section shall survive the termination and/or completion of this Agreement.
- (S) The Subcontractor assumes sole responsibility for reimbursement to the Contractor of any expenditures disallowed should audit or other examination conclude that expenditures from funds allocated to the Subcontractor pursuant to this Subcontract Agreement were not made in compliance with the provisions of this Subcontract Agreement.

5. FURTHER SUBCONTRACTORS.

- (A) Subject to the provisions of this section, work constituting the Project may be further subcontracted. The Subcontractor, pursuant to OMB Circular A-110/A-87 and State OMB Circular 93-05 and as a recipient of federal and state funds, is required to comply with all federal and state procurement guidelines. As such, it is understood that the Subcontractor shall ensure that the terms and conditions of proposed subcontracts are in full compliance with such regulations.
- (B) With regard to each subcontract, the Subcontractor shall maintain all supporting documentation, including an executed agreement with the further subcontractor, on file for review by representatives of the Contractor, the State and the federal government. Each such further subcontract shall provide that the further subcontractor shall be responsible for complying with all federal, state, or local laws and regulations applicable to the performance of this Subcontract Agreement insofar as it relates to work performed by the further subcontractor.
- (C) The Subcontractor shall make no claim for reimbursement for expenditures, which were incurred prior to any subcontract for services performed by the further subcontractor related to such subcontract.
- (D) Each further subcontract shall provide that the further subcontractor shall look only to the Subcontractor for the payment of any claims of any nature whatsoever arising out of such further subcontract.
- (E) The hiring of further Subcontractors or consultants is prohibited without the prior written approval of the Contractor.

6. REPRESENTATIONS, WARRANTIES, AND COVENANTS.

- (A) The Subcontractor covenants that the performance of work and services pursuant to the requirements of this Subcontract Agreement shall conform to professional standards of transportation planning as defined by the State.
- (B) The Subcontractor represents and warrants that to solicit or secure this Subcontract Agreement, no company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Subcontractor, has been employed or retained; and that the Subcontractor has not paid or agreed to pay any company or person, other than a bona fide employee working solely for the Subcontractor, any finder's fee, commission, percentage, brokerage fee, gift or any other consideration, either contingent upon or resulting from the award or making of this Subcontract Agreement.
- (C) The Subcontractor covenants that the patentable results of any demonstration project undertaken under this Subcontract Agreement and all information, designs, specifications, know-how, data, and findings developed in the performance of this Subcontract Agreement, including research studies, shall be made available to the public through either dedication, assignment to the United States, publication, or such other means as the Contractor shall determine.
- (D) The Subcontractor covenants that it shall coordinate with the SJTPO and the Contractor all news releases, publicity and information to the media having to deal with the

progress of the Project. The Subcontractor shall furnish copies of all news releases and clippings to the Contractor.

(E) **Affirmative Action Requirements.** The parties to this Subcontract Agreement hereby incorporate herein the mandatory language of Subsection 3.4(a) of the Regulations promulgated by the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey pursuant to P.L. 1975, c.127, as amended and supplemented, and the Subcontractor agrees to comply fully with the terms, provisions, and obligations thereof; provided that said Subsection shall be applied subject to the terms of Subsection 3.4(d) of said Regulations.

The parties hereto agree further to incorporate herein the mandatory language of section 5.3 of the Regulations promulgated by the Treasurer of the State of New Jersey pursuant to P.L. 1975, c. 127 (N.J.A.C. 17:27), as amended and supplemented from time to time and the Subcontractor agrees to comply fully with the terms, provisions and obligations of said section 5.3.

- (F) **Waiver or Modification.** It is further agreed that no waiver or modification of this Subcontract Agreement or of any covenant or condition hereof shall be valid unless made in writing and duly executed by the parties hereto.
- (G) **Governing Laws.** The parties hereto agree that it is their intention that this Subcontract Agreement shall be construed in accordance with the laws of the State of New Jersey.
- (H) **Compliance with Laws.** The Subcontractor agrees to comply with all local, state, and federal laws, rules, and regulations applicable to this Subcontract Agreement and to the services performed hereunder.

7. INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS.

- (A) The Subcontractor shall secure and maintain in force for the term of this Subcontract Agreement insurance as provided herein. The Subcontractor shall provide the SJTPO with current certificates of insurance for all coverages and renewals thereof, which must contain the proviso that the insurance provided in the certificates shall not be canceled for any reason except after thirty (30) days written notice to the SJTPO. Policies shall be issued by an insurance company authorized to do business in the State of New Jersey. The Policies shall list the SJTPO and Contractors as additional insured, as necessary.
- (B) Insurance similar to that required of the Subcontractor shall be provided by or on behalf of all further subcontractors to cover their operations performed under this Subcontract Agreement and be included in all further subcontracts. The Subcontractor shall not be issued the Notice to Proceed until evidence of the insurance coverage required has been received, reviewed, and approved by the SJTPO.
 - (C) The insurance to be provided by the Subcontractor shall include:

(1) Worker's Compensation and Employer's Liability

(4) Professional Liability Insurance:

(a) Claims Made/Aggregate Basis \$1,000,000

9. INCORPORATION OF APPLICABLE PROVISIONS OF BASIC AGREEMENT.

- (G) **Severability**. If any paragraph of this Agreement or any portion thereof is determined to be unenforceable or invalid by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, which determination is not appealed or appealable, for any reason whatsoever, such unenforceability or invalidity shall not invalidate the whole Agreement, but the Agreement shall be construed as if it did not contain the particular provision held to be invalid and the rights and obligations of the Parties shall be construed and enforced accordingly.
- (H) **Headings**. The division of this Agreement into paragraphs and the use of headings are for convenience of reference only and shall not modify or affect the interpretation or construction of this Agreement or any of its provisions.

- 2. No vendor shall offer or provide any interest, financial or otherwise, direct or indirect, in the business of the vendor or professional activity in which the vendor is involved with the Department officer or employee.
- 3. No vendor shall cause or influence or attempt to cause or influence any NJDOT employee or officer in his or her official capacity in any manner which might tend to impair the objectivity or independence of judgment of that NJDOT officer or employee.
- 4. No vendor shall cause or influence, or attempt to cause or influence, any NJDOT officer or employee to use or attempt to use his or her official position to secure any unwarranted privileges or advantages for that vendor or for any other person.
- 5. No vendor shall offer any NJDOT officer or employee any gift, favor, service or other thing of value under circumstances from which it might be reasonably inferred that such gift, service or other thing of value was given or offered for the purpose of influencing the RECIPIENT in the discharge of his or her official duties. In addition, employees or officers of NJDOT will not be permitted to accept breakfasts, lunches, dinners, alcoholic beverages, tickets to entertainment and/or sporting events or any other item which could be construed as having more than nominal value.
 - **NOTE:** This section would permit an NJDOT employee or officer to accept food or refreshments of relatively low monetary value provided during the course of a meeting, conference or other occasion where the employee is properly in attendance (for example coffee, danish, tea or soda served during a conference break). APPENDIX F

AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT

Equal Opportunity For Individuals With Disabilities.

The RECIPIENT shall, at its own expense, appear, defend, and pay any and all charges for legal services and any and all costs and other expenses arising from such action or administrative proceeding or incurred in connection therewith.

In any and all complaints brought pursuant to the STATE'S grievance procedure, the RECIPIENT agrees to abide by any decision of the STATE which is rendered pursuant to said grievance procedure. If any action or administrative proceeding results in an award of damages against the STATE or if the STATE incurs any expense to cure a violation of the ADA which has been brought pursuant to its grievance procedure, the RECIPIENT shall satisfy and discharge the same at its own expense.

The STATE shall, as soon as practicable after a claim has been made against it, give written notice thereof to the RECIPIENT along with full and complete particulars of the claim. It is further agreed and understood that the STATE assumes no obligation to indemnify or save harmless the RECIPIENT, its agents, servants, employees and subconsultants for any claim which may arise out of their performance of this Agreement. Furthermore, the RECIPIENT expressly understands and agrees that the provisions of this indemnification clause shall in no way limit the RECIPIENT's obligations assumed in this Agreement, nor shall they be construed to relieve the RECIPIENT from any liability, nor preclude the STATE from taking any other actions available to it under any other provisions of this Agreement or otherwise at law.

APPENDIX G

STATE OF NEW JERSEY EQUAL EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITY FOR CONTRACTS FUNDED BY FHWA

The parties to this Agreement do hereby agree that the provisions of NJSA 10:2-1 through 10:2-4 and NJSA 10:5-31 et seq (PL 1975, c 127, as amended and supplemented) dealing with discrimination in employment on public contracts, and the rules and regulations promulgated pursuant thereunto, are hereby made a part of this Agreement and are binding upon them.

- b. The RECIPIENT will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the RECIPIENT, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to age, race, creed, color, national origin, ancestry, marital status or sex;
- c. The RECIPIENT, will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which it has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice, to be provided by the Department of Transportation's Compliance Officer, advising the labor union or worker's representative of the contractor's commitments under this act and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.

The notices referred to in paragraphs a and c may be obtained at the preconstruction conference.

APPENDIX H

During the performance of this contract, the contractor, for itself, its assignees, and successors in interest (hereinafter referred to as the "contractor") agrees as follows:

- 1. Compliance with Regulations: The contractor (hereinafter includes consultants) will comply with the Acts and the Regulations relative to Non-discrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the U.S. Department of Transportation, FHWA, FTA, and/or FAA, as they may be amended from time to time, which are herein incorporated by reference and made a part of this contract.
- 2. **Non-discrimination**: The contractor, with regard to the work performed by it during the contract, will not discriminate on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in the selection and retention of subcontractors, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment. - 3. Solicitations for Subcontracts, Including Procurements of Materials and Equipment: In all solicitations, either by competitive bidding, or negotiation made by the contractor for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurements of materials, or leases of equipment, each potential subcontractor or supplier will be notified by the contractor of the contractor's obligations under this contract and the Acts and the Regulations relative to Non discrimination on the grounds of race, color, or national origin.
- 4. **Information and Reports**: The contractor will provide all information and reports required by the Acts, the Regulations, and directives issued pursuant thereto and will permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and its facilities as may be determined by the Recipient or the **FHWA**, **FTA**, **and/or FAA** to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Acts, Regulations, and instructions. Where any information required of a contractor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish the information, the contractor will so certify to the Recipient or the **FHWA**, **FTA**, **and/or FAA**, as appropriate, and will set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.
- 5. Sanctions for Noncompliance: In the event of a contractor's noncompliance with the Non discrimination provisions of this contract, the Recipient will impose such contract sanctions as it or the FHWA, FTA, and/or FAA may determine to be appropriated including, but not limited to:
 - a. withholding payments to the contractor under the contract until the contractor complies; and/or
 - b. cancelling, terminating, or suspending a contract, in whole or in part.
- 6. Incorporation of Provisions: The contractor will include the provisions of paragraphs one through six in every subcontract, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Acts, the Regulations and directives issued pursuant thereto. The contractor will take action with respect to any subcontract or procurement as the Recipient or the FHWA, FTA, and/or FAA may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance. Provided, that if the contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with litigation by a subcontractor, or supplier because of such direction, the contractor may request the Recipient to enter into any litigation to protect the interests of the Recipient. In addition, the contractor may request the United States to enter into the litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

NOW, THEREFORE, the U.S. Department of Transportation as authorized by law and upon the condition that the **South Jersey Transportation Planning Organization (SJTPO)** will accept title to the lands and maintain the project constructed thereon in accordance with (*Name of Appropriate Legislative Authority*), the Regulations for the Administration of the **Unified Planning Work Program**, and the policies and procedures prescribed by the **FHWA**, **FTA**, **and/or FAA** of the U.S. Department of Transportation in accordance and in compliance with all requirements imposed by Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, U.S. Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Non discrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the U.S Department of Transportation pertaining to and effectuating the provisions of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (78 Stat. 252; 42 U.S.C. § 2000d to 2000d-4), does hereby remise, release, quitclaim and convey unto **SJTPO** all the right, title and interest of the U.S. Department of Transportation in and to said lands described in Exhibit A attached hereto and made a part hereof.

(HABENDUM CLAUSE)

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD said lands and interests therein unto SJTPO and its successors forever, subject, however, to the covenants, conditions, restrictions and reservations herein contained as follows, which will remain in effect for the period during which the real property or structures are used for a purpose for which Federal financial assistance is extended or for another purpose involving the provision of similar services or benefits and will be binding on **SJTPO**, its successors and assigns.

SJTPO, in consideration of the conveyance of said lands and interests in lands, does hereby covenant and agree as a covenant running with the land for itself, its successors and assigns, that (1) no person will on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination with regard to any facility located wholly or in part on, over, or under such lands hereby conveyed [,] [and]* (2) that SJTPO will use the lands and interests in lands and interests in lands so conveyed, in compliance with all requirements imposed by or pursuant to Title 49 1 Code of Federal Regulations, U.S. Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Non-discrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the U.S. Department of Transportation, Effectuation of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and as said Regulations and Acts may be amended L and (3) that in the event of breach of any of the above-mentioned non-discrimination conditions, the Department will have a right to enter or re-enter said lands and facilities on said land, and that above described land and facilities will thereon revert to and vest in and become the absolute property of the U.S. Department of Transportation and its assigns as such interest existed prior to this instruction].*

 - 1. In the event facilities are constructed, maintained, or otherwise operated on the property described in this (deed, license, lease, permit, etc.) for a purpose for which a U.S. Department of Transportation activity, facility, or program is extended or for another purpose involving the provision of similar services or benefits, the (grantee, licensee, lessee, permittee, etc.) will maintain and operate such facilities and services in compliance with all requirements imposed by the Acts and Regulations (as may be amended) such that no person on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, will be excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination in the use of said facilities.
- B. With respect to licenses, leases, permits, etc., in the event of breach of any of the above Non discrimination covenants, **SJTPO** will have the right to terminate the (lease, license, permit, etc.) and to enter, re-enter, and repossess said lands and facilities thereon, and hold the same as if the (lease, license, permit, etc.) had never been made or issued.*
- C. With respect to a deed, in the event of breach of any of the above Non-discrimination covenants, **SJTPO** will have the right to enter or re-enter the lands and facilities thereon, and the above described lands and facilities will there upon revert to and vest in and become the absolute property of **SJTPO** and its assigns. *
